This seminar will give you the information you need to begin using biodiesel in your vehicles. This domestic, renewable, cleaner-burning, American fuel can help your diesel vehicles last longer, in addition to helping our country become less dependent on petroleum.

It is important for you to begin learning about biodiesel for a couple of reasons:

- ▶ It is the fastest growing alternative fuel in the nation; East TN has gone from no fleets or public stations in early 2004 to over 50 fleets and 20 public stations in 2006
- ▶ Total consumption in East TN by the end of 2004 was 90k gals; 2005 – 750k gals
- ▶ Biodiesel can be used in *all* diesel vehicles or piece of equipments
- ▶ Here's how biodiesel can save you money: engine lasts longer (less carbon deposition), potentially better fuel economy, cleaner oil and filters, greater lubricity

In the seminar, the following will be covered:

- ▶ A representative from the East Tennessee Clean Fuels Coalition will provide an overview of what this fuel is, how it's made and its basic pros and cons, in addition to showing how this fuel is growing in use in East Tennessee
- ▶ Several current users will talk about their experience using different biodiesel blends, including representatives of industry, a municipality, a utility, a farmers cooperative and a trucking company
- ▶ We will also discuss its many benefits and what engine manufacturers are saying about using biodiesel in their vehicles
- ▶ There will be a Question & Answer period at the end of the seminar
